- · Conducting and disseminating assessments: 86%
- Conducting research and using evidence-based practices: 83%
- Workforce development: 81%
- Engaging with Board of Health and other policymakers: 80%
- Enforcing public health laws: 79%
- Investigating health problems and environmental public health hazards: 76%
- · Improving access to healthcare: 72%
- Informing and educating about public health: 70%
- Performance management and quality improvement: 67%
- Community engagement: 62%
- · Developing public health policies and plans: 56%
