Kansas Association of Local Health Departments Releases White Paper

The Kansas Association of Local Health Departments (KALHD) is pleased to release a white paper for local health departments in Kansas and beyond to combat vaccine hesitancy for both COVID-19 and routine immunizations. The white paper, titled *Building Vaccine Confidence in Kansas: A Guide for Local Health Departments* details the findings of a January 2022 survey that discovered over 45% of health department professionals in Kansas do not know how to combat misinformation both online and in-person. This white paper offers three recommendations on tackling misinformation including social media, funding, and appreciative inquiry to supplement the survey findings.
