- Participation increased from 1974 (88,000 was half year of data) until 2010 when peaked at 9,175,000 average participants
- 2011 to 2021 decline each year
- 2022 to 2025 increase each year
- As expenditures generally increased with participation

Increase 1975 to 2025

- Food (3.6 to 1) and NSA (9.7 to 1) costs significantly outpace increases in participation.
- Only the average cost per participant has been less than overall inflation
- This data does not indicate if program changes (ex. additional services) may have been implemented that impacted cost.

- Average Annual Inflation Rate 3.66%
- Medical Care Inflation Rate 1,117.41%
- Housing Inflation Rate 581.94%
- Food & Beverage Inflation Rate 457.25%
- Transportation Inflation Rate 443.34%

NSA Costs by State 2021-2025

- Total costs increased by 17.42%
- 48 of 50 States experienced cost increases
 - Alaska experienced decrease in participation and costs.
 - Connecticut had an 8.89% decrease in cost with a 19.59% increase in participants
- Kansas increased by 27.86%


